have been better. Like water and popcorn, seriously?!? Otherwise I loved the dance and the after prom because now I know I am really good at blackjack."

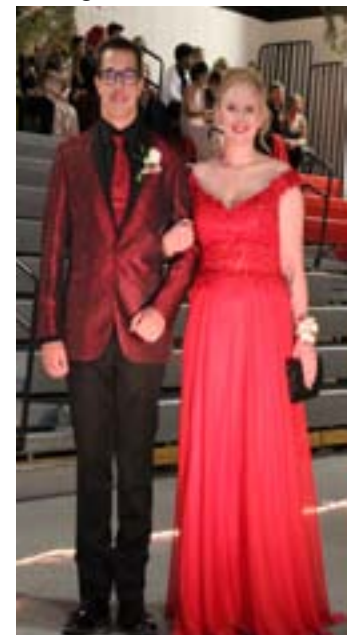

Ellie Beitelspacher exclaimed joyfully: "I won \$75!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!"

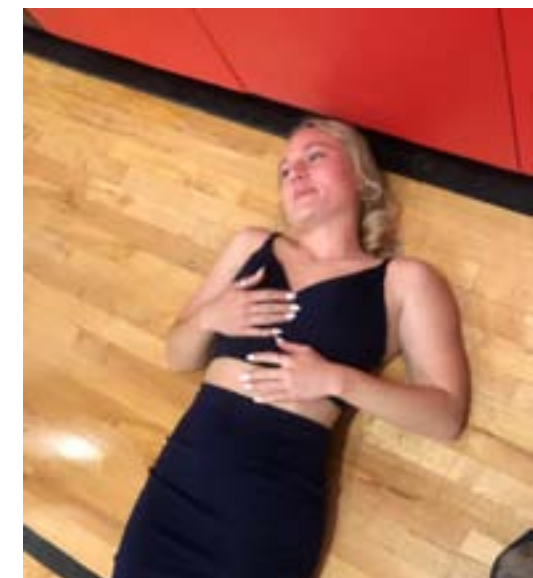

The end of the season is what kids hate the most.

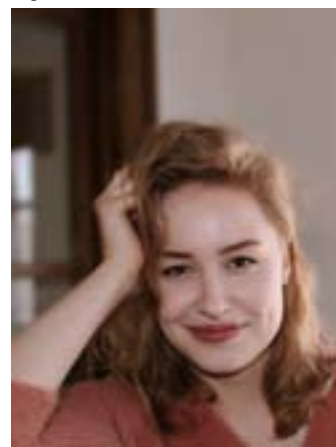
Junior Lucas Hauser states, "I will miss the crowd cheering us on."

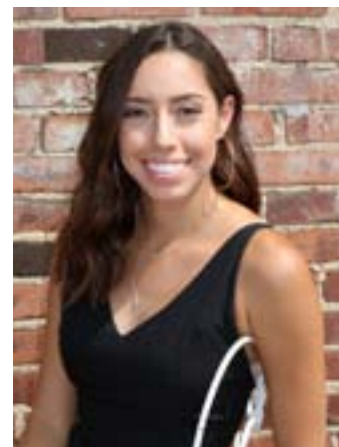
